

**LLANSTEFFAN AND LLANYBRI COMMUNITY COUNCIL
MINUTES OF THE (REMOTE) MEETING HELD ON MONDAY 15th MARCH 2021 AT 7PM**

Item 1 – Apologies

1. There were no apologies.

Item 2 – Disclosures of Interest and Dispensations

All of the above-mentioned groups/associations etc. have put forward grant requests for LLCC consideration at **Item 7**. All members were reminded that if the grant application was over £500, they could not take part in the relevant discussions. However, if the request was below £500, they could comment after declaration as a MOP as per SOs.

- Cllr Ryder declared an interest in relation to **Item 9**. A member of her family works at the shop.

Item 3 – Minutes of the Last Meeting on 14th Feb 2021.

3. **It was resolved that the Minutes of LLCC meeting dated 15th Feb 21 be signed as an accurate record of the meetings with the following amendment:**

Item 4 – Matters Arising/Review of Actions (From Previous Meeting)

- Telephone kiosk refurbishment plan remains ongoing. The door is being fixed and painted. Cllr Charles has asked them to bill LLCC for the goods they have used.
- Coastal Path signs. Clerk has received another email from Sam Walker of Outdoor Recreation Service Team CCC to say the coastal signs would not be rectified until post COVID. Clerk emailed him to be aware that the sign at Second Steps in Llansteffan was a H&S issue, she has not heard back.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> At the Dec meeting the Chair had asked the Clerk to investigate what other Community Councils do to assist with communication of planning applications to the wider community. This issue would be addressed at the April meeting. Wayleave – The Clerk confirmed that Open Reach would be prepared to replace the missing payments if their records confirm that the cheques were not cashed. She continues to pursue the payments and will inform LLCC as soon as they come in. Complaints Policy – To be moved to the April agenda. <p>SOs (Standing Orders) were suspended at 7.10 pm to allow CCllr Jones to give a situation report on the Foreshore issue.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Item 18 on the Feb agenda: Foreshore – CCllr Jones gave the following update. Rosie Carmichael has met with Mr Stacey to discuss the possibility of a local nature reserve at the site. Mr Stacey is in the process of drafting a management plan which will be presented at the next meeting. At that point members of the public will be invited to join a voluntary group to help conserve, improve and maintain the site. Funding sources will be investigated to help pay for tools etc. A MOP asked CCllr Jones if CCC had decided to take on ownership of the strip of Foreshore of land. Production of a Conservation/Environmental Policy – Agree a way forward. Cllr Evans and Cllr Schelewa-Davies had met to look at guidance etc. and have begun to get an idea of what a policy might look like. The Plastic Committee will try to get together before the next full LLCC meeting and will present findings etc. to LLCC at the April meeting. The Chair has written to Mr Harris to give him permission to write formally to CCC in relation to the footpath in front of the Pheasantry. The new Financial Regulations are now on the website. Letter of thanks to Mr Harding, Llanybri. The Clerk received details, address etc. today and will be writing the letter this week. CCllr Jones has produced the new logo for the website. The Chair asked CCllr Jones whether CCC had accepted responsibility for the piece of land now referred to as the Foreshore. The Chair asked the question because a MOP had brought this up last month and follow up was required due to the concern within the community on this issue. The Chair was informed by CCllr Jones that no decision had been made at this stage by CCC. <p>It was resolved that LLCC would accept the new logo. of CCC latest initiatives relating to the opening up Carmarthenshire to tourists in line with the relaxation of COVID 19 restrictions. She explained the situation from a County perspective and gave initial information about how Llansteffan could be supported to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience was had by all, as restrictions are lifted. Her presentation can be viewed on LLCC website.

- Lowri Jones asked LLCC to produce and put forward priorities to her office for consideration. The Clerk was asked to coordinate responses accordingly.

Item 6 – Public Forum

SOs were suspended at 7.33pm to allow for the public to make contributions.

- A MOP asked if CCC could be asked to remove the debris left by the contractors who did the remedial work on the beach drainage pipe a few years ago. There are concrete slabs, plastic piping etc. The MOP was concerned that the area might turn into a fly tip. In response the Chair asked the Clerk to contact CCC about the issue.
- A MOP public also suggested a height restriction barrier be used at the entrance to where camper vans tend to overnight on the Green. The Chair stated that the whole Green issue was on-going and initiatives such as this would be looked at should it be necessary once the way forward with the Green was clear.

Item 7 – Donations/Grants – Awarding of Funds

The following applications were received:

Llanybri Hall - £3000 requested for the renovation of an outbuilding. Community Councils have lawful powers to financially support community halls if they see fit under the Local Gov Act 1976 S.19.

Clerk to note for next agenda

LLCC wish to assist and support every effort to regenerate Llanybri Village Hall. There was not enough money set aside in the 20/21 budget to cover this type of sum, therefore the matter would be considered at the first meeting of the next financial period (April).

Llansteffan School - £ 1000 requested for equipment to develop the outside area as a learning resource for all pupils, particularly Key Stage 2. LLCC have the power to donate to them under the Power of Wellbeing.

£1450 – Agreed by Cllrs.

Llansteffan Hall - £350 requested for a structural engineer to examine the Hall. Community Councils have lawful powers to financially support community halls if they see fit under the Local Gov Act 1976 S.19.

£350 – Agreed by Cllrs.

Llansteffan Sports Association - £750 this is the usual amount they receive through the licence and no application was needed. Relevant extract from the licence as follows:

‘The Council hereby covenants with the Club that it will provide a grant in a sum to be agreed annually for the maintenance of the land which is the subject of this licence’.

They would receive £750 this year and the licence would be reviewed early into the next financial period. Any alteration to the maintenance grant would be considered at the time of review.

<p>Llangain Players - £100 requested to assist with insurance. No finding awarded this year.</p> <p>Short Mat Bowls - £700 requested for the purchase of new bowling equipment. Any Bowls grant money is held within a specific purpose fund in the Llansteffan Memorial Hall accounts. LLCC have the power to donate to them under the Power of Wellbeing. £700 – Agreed by Cllrs.</p> <p>It was resolved to make the awards of funding as detailed above for the Financial period 20/21. Proposed Cllr Charles Seconded Cllr James</p> <p>Item 8 – Tenders – Agreement of Draft Tenders</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Draft tenders were draw up and sent to Cllrs for comment prior to the meeting. After a minor addition relating to the use of weed killer at Llanybri Playground the tenders were agreed. The two tenders (listed below) will be published on the website and in village notice boards: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> MORFA PLAYGROUND, CARRIER’S LANE AND MORFA POND, LLANSTEFFAN LLANYBRI PLAYGROUND AND HEN GAPEL <p>Item 9 – Planning Applications</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> PL/01408 - Erection of a timber building for use as a small village shop - Farmers Arms, Llanybri, Carmarthen, SA33 5HQ <p>It was resolved that LLCC strongly support this application and would recommend approval of PL/01408 as it will be an asset to those living in Llanybri. Proposed Cllr James Seconded Cllr Charles</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> PL/00995 - Demolition of existing rear lean-to extensions - utility/workshop (30sq m). Erection of new single storey rear extension to provide holiday let (66sq m) - Brynarlais, Old Road, Llansteffan, Carmarthen, SA33 5JJ <p>It was resolved that LLCC would make no objections to PL/00995. Proposed Cllr Charles Seconded Cllr Evans</p> <p>Item 10 – Benches</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ed Davies had completed the example refurbishment and Cllrs agreed the bench looked excellent. The final cost was £384 (incl VAT) and below his original quote. 3 benches will be refurbished and go to the 3 people currently on the waiting list. Cllr Evans put forward the following costs: £400 for the refurbishment, approx. £36 for plaque, depending on inscription, £60 for siting (approx.) future maintenance £100. Therefore, a final figure of around £600. Cllrs Evans asked if councillors would be happy if this went up to around £650, they agreed. The exact price proposal to individuals is TBC by RFO and Cllr Evans and agreed by LLCC. Cllr Ryder and Cllr Charles queried whether the maintenance figure would be adequate. Cllr Robinson suggested time limited commissions. There was some further discussion relating to this issue after which the Chair stated that this issue needed more discussion at a future meeting when deciding on the future Bench Policy. There are 6 benches remaining and available to those who wish to commission a bench. 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- As there are few benches remaining and very little space to site extra benches Cllr Evans suggested LLCC investigate other forms of memorial (e.g., Trees). Cllr Robinson suggested a memorial wall. This issue will be discussed at a future meeting.
- The Bench Policy would be drafted and presented at a meeting in the near future.
- It was agreed that 2 benches would go as they were to Llanybri Park.
- It was agreed that a spare bench could be relocated to Maes Griffiths on temporary loan for the residence to enjoy the newly acquire view. The bench will sit on sleepers. Cllr Evans is coordinating this.

Item 14 – Meeting with County Councillor

CCllr Jones went through her report, a copy of which can be found on the website. The issues she highlighted were as follows:

- Industrial Farming Task Force - The Task Force has met with Mr. Richards, Cwrt Malle. See CCllr Jones' Monthly Report for details.
- Ffermio Forum - The forum has met with Ioan Williams of NRW. See CCllr Jones' Monthly Report for details.
- Beach Play Area is almost complete. Cllr Robinson asked CCllr Jones whether there was any possibility of the surface in the newly refurbished beach park being made wheel chair accessible. At the time CCllr Jones confirmed that she would look into the issue.
- Local Woodlands – CCllr Jones stated she welcomed any queries re. tree-felling/woodland clearance, and would check that any such work was authorised. See CCllr Jones' Monthly Report for details.
- Ash Die-Back - It is likely to cause the loss of around 98% of Ash trees in Carmarthenshire. See CCllr Jones' Monthly Report for details. Cllr Evans asked CCllr Jones whether CCC were considering any mitigating action in relation to the loss of Ash across the County. CCllr Jones indicated that CCC were planning to take action to mitigate the loss.
- Cockle Fishery - A debrief meeting was held with the Fisheries to review the 2020 cockle season. See CCllr Jones' Monthly Report for details.

Item 15 – Matters for Information

- Road Sign at Down Farm – Was fixed now broken again. CCllr Jones offered to take this issue up.
