THE GREEN, LLANSTEFFAN:

I am in discussion with Peter Hughes-Griffiths, Cabinet Member for Culture, Sport and Tourism, and Ian Jones, Head of Leisure, regarding strategies and funding opportunities for an overall vision for the use of, and services provided, at the Llansteffan Beach area from its southernmost point to its northern boundary. We are working with Legal Services and other departments to establish amenity for residents and visitors which will be robust for the future. In the short term we are addressing improvements that can be made by the Spring 2022 season. I hope to be in a position to request an agenda item in your December or January Meeting when we can discuss partnership and consultation plans for the longer-term resolution of issues relating to this area.

LORD'S PARK FARM - CONSULTATION:

An Open Day at Lord's Park Farm took place the 23rd October, following which further dialogue will held. The Open Day gave us the opportunity to appreciate the significance of the farm and to recognise the potential to local families/individuals who may be interested in creating a business plan for the future at Lord's Park. A further community consultation event is planned for December.

YSGOL LLANSTEFFAN:

The federation of Bancyfelin, Llansteffan and Llangain schools has held an informal induction session for the new governing body - additional to the required training - in order to establish governors' roles and responsibilities and raise awareness of the schools' status within our communities. I will provide information and updates on activities in my monthly reports. I have enrolled on three formal governor training sessions over the next three weeks.

SENEDD CYMRU - CONSULTATION ON SECOND HOMES:

Senedd Cymru has launched a consultation as part of its enquiry into Second Homes in Wales. Dr. Simon Brooks' report to the Senedd has identified issues most pertinent to us in this community, and this should be a priority for our local agenda if we are to remain a sustainable community. LOCAL DEMOCRACY AND BOUNDARY COMMISSION WALES:

Following the decision to unite Llansteffan county ward with St. Clears, I have made a formal complaint against Rebecca Evans MS (Minister for Local Government) regarding the actual decision

and the Local Democracy and Boundary Commission Wales regarding the errors and omissions in its Final Recommendations. I have forwarded the complaint to Sophie Howe, the Future Generations Commissioner. The complaint is lengthy and forensic and I have placed a copy with the Clerk. I am happy to forward it to any members who would like to examine its content.

COCKLING:

Although the Llansteffan cockle beds closed formally on 7th September, some reopening of this bed on Wednesdays and Thursdays is necessary due to cockle rushing after stormy weather. Llanybri bed remains open on Saturdays and Sundays with access from Ginst only. All beds are due to close on the 31st December at the latest.

I have attended further Planning training and a seminar with Dwr Cymru/Welsh Water.
